There are also additional prayers of Thanksgiving on pages 836-841. Praising and thanking God shapes us to be vessels of his joy and love- the fruit of His Holy Spirit within us.



month of November as a way of setting you up for a Thanksgiving and Advent season like never before!




SUNDAY, DECEMBER 8 5:00 p.m.

Looking to Join Christ Church?

If you are already an Episcopalian this only requires a letter of transfer that is easily arranged through the church office. If you are coming from another denomination or are new to church in general consider signing up for the Adult Confirmation Class that begins January 12th and meets twice a month in the church parlor until Confirmation. (Call the church office to sign up.) This class is also open to anyone who would like to learn more about the Episcopal Church and using our Book of Common Prayer for worship and spiritual formation.

If you are joining the Episcopal Church coming from the Roman Catholic, Lutheran, Methodist, or Presbyterian Church you would be "Received" into the Episcopal Church by the bishop. If you are joining us from another denomination and have been baptized you would be Confirmed. The Confirmation service for youth and adults will be at Christ Church on May 3, 2020. For adults who have not yet been baptized and would like to explore that possibility please speak with either of our priests at any time.



TE DEUM LAUDAMUS: We Praise thee, O God!

This was our theme at this year's Royal School of Church Music course in Durham, North Carolina. Each year I am blessed to join a world-class staff and 100 other choristers to make joyful music praising our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Words often fall short in their attempt to express the abundance of God's creation, and for many, only the power of music is able to excite the soul!

The *Te Deum* is an ancient hymn attributed to St. Ambrose (A.D. 397) and St. Augustine (A.D. 430) and like the Apostles' Creed it is divided into distinct sections praising the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. What I find so special about this hymn of praise is found at the very end. "We therefore pray thee, help thy servants, whom thou hast redeemed with thy precious blood. Make them to be numbered with thy saints, in glory everlasting."

"Because we believe in a God that can do more than we can ask or imagine, we are not defined by are brokenness or by our shortcomings, we are not shackled by our illnesses or our sadnesses, we are not chained to our possessions or our demographics, we are not bound up in the opinions of others or in our own bad behavior. MINISTRY of the MONTH: Appleton Episcopal Ministries



"Sharing God's love by partnering with parishes in the Middle GA Convocation to support the health, safety, education and well-being of children and families."

Over the past five years, Appleton has helped parishes in the Middle GA Convocation to develop new ministries and support existing ministries with annual program grants and one-time discretionary grants totaling just under \$124,000.00. These monies help to make possible the Christ Church Weekend Lunch program, a diaper bank at Loaves and Fishes, a protein food pantry and backpack program in Eatonton, a food bank and utility support program in Milledgeville, and a garden and nutrition program in Montezuma; matched

start-up fees for Path to Shine programs (PTS) at St. Christopher's in Perry; St. Paul's in Macon, and All Saints in Warner Robins and given operating support for Path to Shine Lynmore Estates and the three new PTSs; funded arts enrichment activities for young people in grades K-12; assisted Crisis Line/Safe House with special projects; established a new campus ministry program at Georgia College and State University; encouraged the Canterbury Club tutoring and mentoring program at Fort Valley State University; and supported construction of eight Little Free Libraries across Peach County. We also offer our 15-passenger van at a very nominal cost to provide weekly transportation for both Macon Path to Shine programs, for campus ministry trips, and for EYC outings and retreats.

In summer 2020, Appleton will present its fourth CDF Freedom School, a full-time, six-week literacy and enrichment program for 50 1st – 3rd graders at no charge to their families. This program costs \$62,000 in cash expenses, matched by more than \$60,000 in in-kind contributions.

We receive no money from the operating budget of The Diocese of Atlanta and rely on contributions from parishes and individuals like you. We need your help and support to make all of these programs possible. Please give generously. Thank you.

Because it is in Macon many others from Christ Church are involved in planning for and participating in this event. Thank you to all for your faithful service!


