
We will be joining forces with a number of other congregations for this service and intend for it to be available for any in the community who might be blessed by this ministry.



A \$75 deposit to hold your youth(s) space or spaces is due by Sunday, December 15. Checks may be made to Christ Church.



Looking to Join Christ Church?

If you are already an Episcopalian this only requires a letter of transfer that is easily arranged through the church office. If you are coming from another denomination or are new to church in general consider signing up for the Adult Confirmation Class that begins January 12th and meets twice a month in the church parlor until Confirmation. (Call the church office to sign up.) This class is also open to anyone who would like to learn more about the Episcopal Church and using our Book of Common Prayer for worship and spiritual formation.

If you are joining the Episcopal Church coming from the Roman Catholic, Lutheran, Methodist, or Presbyterian Church you would be "Received" into the Episcopal Church by the bishop. If you are joining us from another denomination and have been baptized you would be Confirmed. The Confirmation service for youth and adults will be at Christ Church on May 3, 2020. For adults who have not yet been baptized and would like to explore that possibility please speak with either of our priests at any time.

The 113th Annual Council of the Diocese of Atlanta was a big success. Hosted by the Middle Georgia Convocation, this year's meeting was held in Macon at the Edgar Wilson Convention Center and Marriott Hotel. The Right Reverend Victor Atta-Baffoe, Bishop of Cape Coast, Ghana, was Council's honored guest. In addition to Rev. Cynthia Knapp, Christ Church's delegates to this year's Council were Mark and Bonnie Smith, Tripp and Suzanne Maddux, and Lynn Waggonner.

Christ Church members Julie Groce and Richard Hughes and staff member Jonathan Poe helped to plan and oversee the opening Worship Service on Friday morning. We'd like to thank all of those who participated in the service: Richard Hughes, Head Verger; Bonnie Collins, Verger; Jack Minette, Thurifer; Julie Groce, Boater and Credence Table Server; Elijah and Sophia Hopper, torch bearers; and Harry Groce, who read the Second Lesson in Spanish.

All of the Convocational clergy, including our own Rev. Cynthia Knapp served as paten and chalice bearers for Eucharist, which was celebrated by The Right Rev. Robert Wright, Bishop of Atlanta. Jonathan Poe served as Organist and Choirmaster, and several members of the Christ Church Choir participated in the Convocational Choir.

Philip Groce built a temporary altar to match the dimensions of the Christ Church altar so that wine and host could be consecrated for nearly 550 worshippers from around the Diocese. Altar Guild Chairman Nan Harper coordinated the communion elements and linens, and Flower Guild Chairman Ginny Rozier and Barbara Domingos created a beautiful harvest arrangement surrounding the Appleton Memorial Cross, which rose behind the altar. Bonnie Collins and Christine Hoskins served as Verger/Tellers during the two-day Council Meeting. Laura Evans and Cacey Hopper worked as volunteers with Diocesan staff, and Lynn Wagonner and the Cloister Shop offered a wonderful selection of items for sale in the vendor area.
