RECTOR'S MESSAGE

Holy Silence

In our culture today with our devices to constantly keep us connected, informed, and plugged into what is going on around us, we have lost our ability to just sit and be quiet. It's hard to unplug. It's almost unthinkable to just sit quietly and wait without being able to read something, watch something, or be on our devices. It has become so common to become slaves to our phones, iPads, computers, and televisions. It breaks my heart to see families out to dinner together with each of them on their phone instead of talking to one another. These things that are supposed to make us more connected are actually breaking down our ability to be in relationships in person. They have also kept us from taking the time to be comfortable just in

our own thoughts, allowing time to process and unwind. My daughter Lia wrote a song called "Peace and Quiet" that is a commentary on this very problem particularly (but certainly not exclusively!) among the younger generations. We have lost our ability to comfortably simply sit in peace and quiet. It's become yet another way of medicating ourselves or masking the anxiety or stress.

Even in our prayer time we often don't take the time to listen. We seem to often feel the need to do all the talking as if it's on us to be sure to tell God everything we need covered. We forget to just sit in the Lord's presence, to listen for the voice of God, and to be filled with the love and presence of God through the Holy Spirit. Too often we read Scripture to do the reading of the day or get through a certain book of the Bible without just allowing God's Word to speak into our hearts. And then we wonder why God feels so far away. Our lives have been filled with so much noise (figuratively and literally) that we have lost the ability to sit in silence and wait upon the Lord.

One of the stories in Scripture that addresses this is the story of Elijah when he was on the run from Jezebel and is hiding in a cave. God has just defeated the priests of Baal in a spectacular showdown, demonstrating the power and presence of God in a way that should have left Elijah praising and glorifying God. Instead he was afraid of what Jezebel would do to him after she heard all her priests were dead. When he finally stops running and finds a cave up on a mountain to hide in, God asks, What are you doing here Elijah? Elijah complains to God that he is the only faithful prophet left and that his life is in danger too. The Lord tells him to go and stand on the mountain in the presence of the Lord for the Lord is about to pass by. Then a mighty wind came and tore the mountain and the rocks but God was not in the wind. After that an earthquake but the Lord was not in

the earthquake. Then came a fire but the Lord was not in the fire. Then there was a still small voice (or a gentle whisper). When Elijah heard it, he pulled his cloak over his face and went out to the mouth of the cave. The Lord was in the still small voice and Elijah knew it.

We look for God to make himself known to us in those dramatic earth shattering ways. We expect God to get our attention with a miracle or a dramatic show of power. But God more often speaks to us in the silence, in those quiet moments of listening for the voice of the Lord. He speaks to us through His Word, and by whispering into our hearts and our minds. But we need to be listening and to learn to recognize the voice of God. We need to be willing to shut off the noise and the many things clamoring for our attention, to take time for the Lord. That even means setting aside our devices- unplugging from what everyone else has to say and listening for the voice of the Lord. We need to return to being comfortable with silence. "Be still and know that I am God." (Psalm 46:10).

We have periods of silence built into our worship intentionally. It is to allow us to listen for the voice of the Lord. It gives us that time to rest from the constant rush and the noise of the world and of our devices constantly feeding us information to process. It gives us time to just be still and know. Just know that you are loved by God and take the time to allow the Lord to fill you with an awareness of his love. Listen to the music, the Scripture readings, and the sermon in a way that allows the Lord to speak to you through the words. Be present in the moment instead of several steps ahead. Lord knows it's hard. But it is also such a blessing when we return to that practice. Like anything we just have to retrain ourselves to listen, to be, to rest in the silence, and to know the presence of the Lord. He is there with us all the time, but we have to take the time to be aware and to listen.

meal. For others, it may be a place to escape loneliness, find a friendly face, or simply know that someone cares.

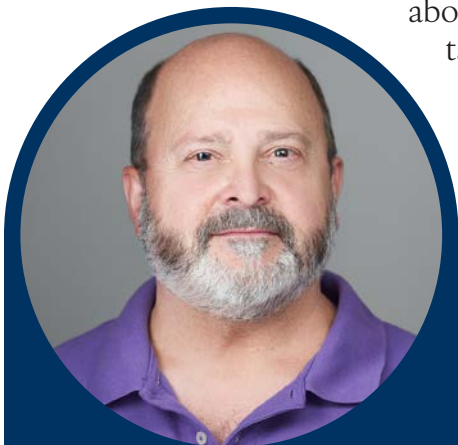

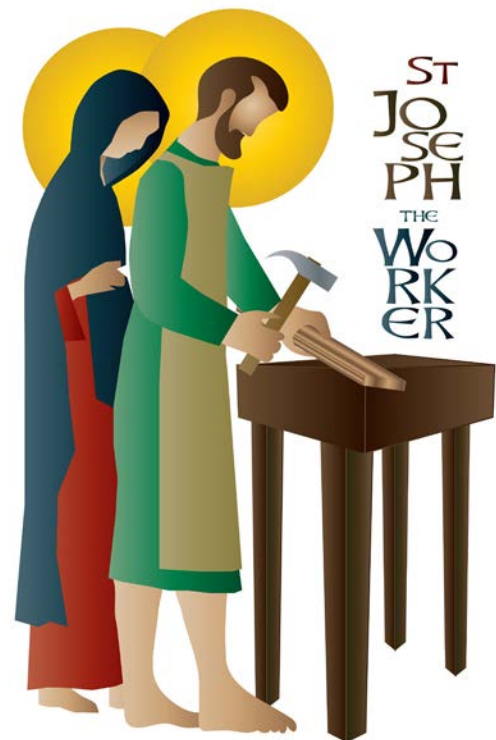

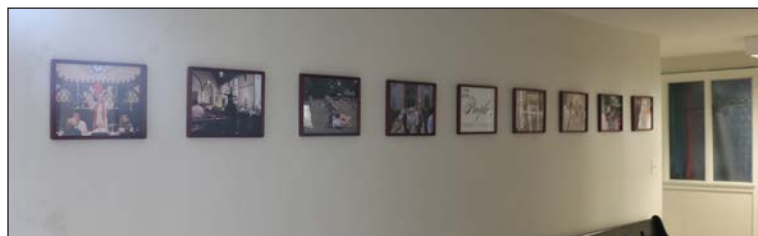


PARISH NEWS

Solar Power Class July 2026

There is no electrical power in Trouin. Solar power can provide a light at night, charge a cell phone, or power a radio.

St. Marc School provides a Solar Power Class each year for students who have attended the electrical power class and people of the community.

Solar Class starts in the classroom and continues with cleaning and learning about the solar panels.

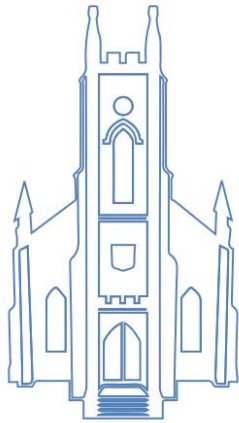


The students also learn what devices are needed to control how the electrical current from the panels is used to charge a battery, convert the solar panel electrical current from DC to AC, and how to safely connect an electrical device.
